SLP21001: Osoyoos Crescent Water Main Installation

A permit application was received on January 4, 2021, for the replacement and installation of new water main piping along Osoyoos Crescent, from Thunderbird Boulevard on the north end to the RCMP building access lane in the south. Work is also expected to take place along Acadia Park Lane from Osoyoos Crescent to approximately the northernmost temporary daycare site. Work is expected to start the week of January 11-15.

DP14027T-12T, DP16013-10T, DP03055-4T, DP08030-10T: Tempoary Patio Tents

On December 23, 2020, development permit amendments were issued for temporary patio enclosures to be added to the commercial retail units at the Focal (6111 University Blvd), Central (6015 University Blvd), David Strangway (5950 University Blvd), and Mews (3333 Wesbrook Mall) buildings to help offset limited indoor seating capacities due to current COVID-19 health restrictions.

DP03051-2: Somerset Tree Removals

On December 8, 2020, a development permit amendment was issued for the removal of three birch trees that were infected with birch borers in the landscape area of the Somerset townhomes (6360-6388 Larkin Drive and 2602-2616 West Mall) in Hawthorne Place. Replacement trees are will be provided.
