## NURSE LOG

A fallen tree that decomposes and gives life to new plants; supporting the ecosystem.



## BIKE SHARE

2040 target is to have  $\frac{2}{3}$  of trips to and from UBC made by cycling, transit, and walking.

## BLACK-CAPPED CHICKADEE

Listen for a "chicka-dee-dee-dee" bird song, and look in gardens and forests for their nests.



## MOSS

Moss grows in damp, shady environments, providing habitat for micro-organisms and biodiversity.



## GREEN DEPOT

A UNA zero waste centre accepting residential waste - textiles, soft plastics, styrofoam, electronics, batteries, and more.



## COMMUNITY GARDEN PLOT

Residents grow their own food and flowers in the 200+ UNA garden plots, and the UNA children's garden.

## ENGLISH IVY

This introduced species is a powerful vine that climbs along forest floors and up trees, suppressing native plants.



## EV CHARGING STATION

Electric Vehicles (EV) offer alternative energy for vehicles, reducing greenhouse gas emissions.
